

GUIDE TO RECYCLABLE MATERIAL

<p>PAPER</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Newspaper • Coated paper (circulars, magazines) • Office paper • Kraft paper (brown bags) • Envelopes with or without plastic window 	<p>PAPER</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carbon paper • Tissue paper and paper towels • Waxed paper • Paper contaminated with food, oil, etc. • Potato bags • Air-pack mailer envelopes (paper outside with plastic bubble pack inside)
<p>CARDBOARD</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heavy corrugated cardboard (maximum 1m x 1/2m)¹ • Boxboard and corrugated cardboard (cereal boxes, pizza boxes, etc.)^{1,2} • Moulded pulp (egg cartons, etc.) • Milk cartons, juice cartons, frozen food boxes³ • Aluminium-lined juice cartons (e.g. Tetra Pak)³ • Packaging with clear plastic glued to boxboard (from light bulbs, tools, etc.) 	<p>CARDBOARD</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cardboard soaked with oil, paint, ect. • Cans with cardboard sides and metal lids
<p>PLASTIC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plastics type 1 through 7 (except unacceptable items in right column) • Food product containers (from margarine, yogurt, ice cream, muffins, etc.) • Containers from maintenance products (dishwashing liquid, bleach, etc.) • Containers from cosmetic products (shampoo, cream, etc.) • Plastic lids and caps • Grocery and produce bags⁵ • Plastic shopping bags⁵ • Bags from bread and milk⁵ • Plastic toys free of ANY metal parts • Plastic gardening pots free of earth • Compact discs, DVDs and cases 	<p>PLASTIC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plastic film (cellophane, saran wrap) • Shrink Wrap • Chip bags • Bags from frozen fruits and vegetables • Bags from plastic netting (from onions, oranges, etc.) • Thin moulded plastic used in packaging chocolates, cookies, etc. • Plastic bags inside cereal boxes • Bubble pack • Plastic bags in which magazines are mailed • Bags from potting soil, mulch, fertilizers, etc. • Feed bags (woven plastic) • Hay bailing bags • Styrofoam (gardening pots, containers or pieces) • Garden hose • Rope (nylon, hay bailing, clothes line, etc.) • Biomedical products (syringes, needles, etc.) • Containers from motor oil, turpentine, gasoline or other dangerous goods)
<p>GLASS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ONLY bottles and containers (without metal lids)⁶ 	<p>GLASS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pyrex, tableware, porcelain, ceramics • Windows, mirrors • Light bulbs, fluorescent, tubes • Fiberglass
<p>METAL</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tin cans (with or without labels)⁶ • Caps and lids • Aluminium beverage cans • Aluminium foil • Clean aluminium foil and plates • Metal pieces under 2 Kg and under 60 cm long 	<p>METAL</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All types of batteries • Container from paint, strippers, etc. • Aerosol cans • Metal coat hangers and wire

All containers must be rinsed out.

1. Please collapse boxes to save space.
2. Residual food must be removed from pizza boxes and other restaurant delivery boxes.
3. It is not necessary to remove the plastic spout from milk, juice and Tetra Pack type containers.
4. Plastic caps should remain on plastic containers.
5. Plastic bags should be gathered and compressed into a plastic bag.
6. Labels can be left on cans and glass containers.

Remember to place used motor oil and paint in specially marked bins
