Robin complained about loud parties in Norway Bay and about ATV's racing on the Second Line. He also questioned the status of the Heritage Centre on Highway 148. When he has informed that it is currently closed, he inquired if council had any intention of reopening it.

Paul Hinch asked where the bag idea came from for the waste disposal contract.

Robin commented that you produce very little garbage if you compost. He inquired if the municipality could implement a discount program on the environmental tax for those who compost.

Teddy Ambridge inquired if council had a back-up plan in the event that Tom Orr refuses to renegotiate the contract in November.

John Ludington requested additional calcium on Dodd.

James Walker asked why everyone is getting 100 garbage bags.

Archie Greer questioned the speed bumps. They are to be relocated to River Road.

Bruce Robertson inquired if the work on Elmside Road was scheduled for this year.

Another ratepayer questioned when the work would be completed on Elmside Road.

A ratepayer commented that the 2010 budget was not posted on the municipal website.

Don Reynolds complimented the municipal workers for their assistance with the construction of the transfer station building.

James Walker questioned the progress of high speed internet access with Picanoc.net, he was informed to contact WE PC.
